

Supporting Staff & Patients

Memorial Garden for muchloved Prof Richardson unveiled

Professor Richardson's Memorial Garden has been created in memory of Professor James Richardson – known affectionately to his colleagues and patients as 'Prof'.

Located within the courtyard outside the hospital's Baschurch Day Unit the serene garden was made possible thanks to a number of generous donations; including £10,000 from the Friends.

The garden offers a peaceful and tranquil space for staff and patients to reflect.



Work on the UK's first dedicated orthopaedic centre for Armed Forces veterans formally began in June with an official ground-breaking ceremony.

The pioneering facility is being built onsite at RJAH thanks to a charitable grant of £6 million from Headley Court Charity.

The hospital had initially launched a £1.5 million appeal back in October 2018 to build a more modest outpatient facility for veterans, but is now set to boast a vaster facility. The Friends were delighted to kick off the fundraising campaign with a donation of £100,000.

Friends help to mark celebration days

Two important celebration days have been marked at RJAH, with the help of their Friends.

International Nurses Day which takes place every year to remember the birthday of Florence Nightingale – the nurse who founded modern nursing, alongside Operating Department Practitioners (ODP) Day which began in 2018 to recognise the profession.

We had the pleasure of arranging gifts of a personalised mug and self-care products for each of our nurses and all our ODPs received a dianthus plant.







Supporting Staff & Patients

Friends help Orthotics to take exciting new steps

The Friends have funded an innovative piece of equipment to benefit the hospital's Orthotics department - two 3D L.A.S.A.R Posture Plates that will be used in the treatment of patients at RJAH.

The posture plates provide an instant assessment of a patient's posture, showing where their weight bearing line sits - with cameras linked to each plate they also provide real time data to both the patient and clinician.

The equipment will be used to compare different orthoses on patients in order to find the optimum brace for them, along with being used to fine tune the fitting of an orthosis to ensure the greatest result is achieved.

The purchase of the 3D L.A.S.A.R Posture Plates cost over £15,000.

Jane Dewsbury, Principle Orthotist, said: "I'm very grateful to the League of Friends for supporting the Orthotics department."

RJAH unveils £50,000 cuttingedge orthosis with help from Friends

The Mobile Arm Rehabilitation Kit (MARK) – a powered arm and hand orthosis designed to help restore function to paralysed or weakened upper limbs – is now available for patients thanks to a £50,000 investment from the Friends.

The RJAH is currently the only NHS Trust in the UK with access to this piece of equipment.

Mr Simon Pickard, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon who specialises in hand and upper limb surgery – was the driving force behind the purchase of the MARK system.

He said: "This is a really innovative and progressive piece of equipment that will benefit a large cohort of our patients going forward – especially those with weakened muscles or paralysis that require intensive rehabilitation."





This equipment provides a real technical advancement, not only within Orthotics at RJAH, but nationally as the use of supporting technical equipment within the Orthotics industry has been very slow up until this point.





As the first NHS Trust to have this system, it means we have the opportunity to be involved in high-quality research and will allow us, as a hospital, to provide our patients with world-class care.

Heather Thomas-Bache, Head of Voluntary Services for the League of Friends, said: "Volunteers' Week is a time to say thank you every single one of our wonderful volunteers - those who have supported RJAH throughout the pandemic and those who usually volunteer but haven't been able to due to Covid-19.

"Our long-term service badges are a small token of our thanks for the incredible amount of support our volunteers provide to staff, patients and relatives at RJAH. They're also to let those who remain at home know that we're thinking of them and looking forward to when we're able to welcome them back."

Susan Heer, who currently volunteers in the Vaccination Centre and on the Covid-19 Screening Desk, has just collected her gold badge to mark 12 years of service.

She said: "I thoroughly enjoy being part of the Friends volunteer family and the past twelve years have flown by - I will wear my gold badge with pride!"
