

# Friends celebrate hospital milestones

Celebrations have taken place to mark three momentous milestones at RJAH



The Festival on the Field took place on Saturday 7th August to mark 100 years since Shropshire's specialist orthopaedic hospital relocated to Gobowen, along with 60 years of support from the League of Friends, and 50 years of the Orthopaedic Institute.

The 60's themed festival, which we organised alongside Shropshire Festivals, was opened by Oswestry Town Mayor, Councillor Mark Jones, and Mayoress Ruth Jones.

The daytime saw a family-friendly event involving live music, craft stalls, food and drink and children's entertainment. During the evening there was a swinging sixties themed disco for adults to enjoy.

We were delighted to be joined for the afternoon by guest speakers who have recently received funding for equipment from our charity; Mr Simon Pickard, Jack O'Brien and Sophie Kelly.

Mr Pickard, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon, discussed the Mobile Arm Rehabilitation Kit - a device used to enhance the rehabilitation of upper limb function in those paralysed through stroke, spinal cord or peripheral nerve injury.

Jack O'Brien and Sophie Kelly joined us from the Orthotics Department and talked about their Laser Posture Plates - equipment used to provide an instant assessment of a patient's posture.

Earlier in the year we launched our new look interactive website which includes a wealth of information on volunteering opportunities, upcoming events, general news and ways in which people can donate.


In addition a key feature is our online shop – items for sale include popular card designs and branded goods.

# Friends support Prosthetists and Orthotists (P&O) Day

Prosthetists and Orthotists (P&O) Day - organised by the British Association of Prosthetists & Orthotists (BAPO) took place at RJAH last month.

As part of celebrations we were delighted to organise gifts for the Orthotics Team who raised awareness of the work they do across the Trust by offering assessments for staff to see if they're symmetrical by using their laser posture plate equipment.



To mark 100 years since RJAH relocated to its famous Gobowen base a special burial ceremony of a time capsule has taken place.

Working alongside Marie Carter, the Trust's Archive Officer, we pulled together the contents of the capsule, which included a huge variety of items such as photos from over the past 100 years, video messages from current members of staff, and newspaper cuttings. A brick that was used to build the original hospital site in Baschurch has also been sourced for the time capsule.

It will be dug up in 50 years' time, to send a message to future staff and patients.

### Nominations received for RJAH Celebration of Achievements

We are thrilled to have been nominated for 'Outstanding Team Achievement of the Year' in RJAH's Celebration of Achievements Awards, along with our Charity Director, Victoria, who has been nominated for the 'Richard Clarke Unsung Hero of the Year'.

# Fantastic fundraising

### Charity swim raises much needed funds for Friends

Our annual open water swim fundraiser has raised an incredible £20,000.

The Mere Mile took place on Monday 30th August and saw almost 200 swimmers take the plunge and attempt to swim one mile or 2.5 miles in the Mere, Ellesmere.

The event followed on from the success of last year's Mere Mile, where over 100 swimmers took part and raised £8500 for the benefit of RJAH.

James Bainbridge of Swimfinity said: "We're really pleased to have been able to help facilitate the event again after a successful first year in 2020.

"A significant growth in swimmer numbers underlined the continued popularity of open water swimming, and the amount raised for charity shows the high regard people have for our wonderful local hospital.

"We're already looking forward to 2022, building on the success of the last two years and continuing to support such a worthy cause – The League of Friends."

A number of staff members from the Oswestry based hospital also took part in the event – participants included Dr Ruth Longfellow, RJAH's Chief Medical Officer, who took part in the 2.5 mile swim.





Ruth said: "We're so grateful to our League of Friends for holding fundraising events such as the Mere Mile – they raise valuable funds that directly support frontline staff and patients.

"There was a great atmosphere on the day, and it was a pleasure to be part of something so positive."

Over 40 volunteers also dedicated their time to help with the running of the event, including members of the Borderlands and Ellesmere Rotary Clubs, safety boat crews, along with kayakers and stand-up paddle boarders who took to the water to ensure the swimmers were kept safe throughout.

The event was sponsored by Shropshire Pools & Spas.
