# RJAH Friends sign Covenant to support Armed Forces

The League of Friends have pledged their support for staff and volunteers who serve in military roles by signing up to the Armed Forces Covenant.

The Covenant, which has also been signed by the Oswestry based hospital's Senior Leadership Team, represents a pledge of support by the Friends charity to people who are serving in, or who have served in the Armed Forces.

This includes supporting the employment of both veterans or their partners and any employees who serve with the Reserve forces by accommodating their training and deployment where possible.

The Covenant was signed on behalf of the Friends charity by Chairman Peter David. Representing the Armed Forces was Lt Col Carl Meyer, who is also the Veterans' Clinical Director at RJAH.

Peter David said: "The League of Friends is pleased to support this excellent initiative and to acknowledge and support all those connected with our Armed Forces.

"It reflects the important work of the Trust, and it is right as their partners that we too align with these values."

A pioneering veterans facility is being built onsite at RJAH – the initial fundraising appeal was launched in October 2018 and was kickstarted with a £100,000 donation from the hospital Friends.

The RJAH had initially launched a £1.5 million appeal to build a more modest outpatient facility for veterans but is now set to boast a vaster £6 million facility, following a grant from the Headley Court Charity.

# Charitable funds support spinal injury patients' rehabilitation at RJAH

For patients with a spinal cord injury at RJAH community re-integration is a key part of their rehabilitation – this has just been made easier thanks to the support of charitable funds.

The League of Friends and RJAH Charity have jointly funded the purchase of a wheelchair accessible vehicle for the benefit of spinal injury patients at the Oswestry based hospital.

The vehicle cost in excess of £37,000.

As part of the rehabilitation programme, integration back into the community is encouraged prior to discharge home – this may include trips to local shopping centres, garden centres or to sporting venues, where wheelchair sports activities can be trialled.

Benefits of access to a wheelchair accessible vehicle include staff transporting patients with an improved quality of journey to and from their home, work, and school. These visits are required to ensure the safe and good quality discharge from hospital to home after a life changing spinal cord injury.

Julie Smith, Therapy Team Lead, said: "As many of our patients are wheelchair users, getting in and out of a car can be difficult. Use of a wheelchair accessible vehicle allows patients to be transported safely and comfortably, visiting home or going on social trips during their long inpatient stays.





"Without access to a vehicle of this kind, many of our patients would miss out on aspects of the patient journey which enable us to provide a good quality rehabilitation program, as well as a safe and successful transition from hospital to home.

"We are extremely grateful to the League of Friends and RJAH Charity for the generous donation which has allowed us to purchase this vehicle – it will continue to benefit patients for many years to come."

Harry Turner, Chair at RJAH, said: "It's wonderful to see two of our hospital charities working in collaboration for the benefit of patients – we are extremely appreciative to both charities for their invaluable support."

## Hospital Friends hold third successful open water swim event

An open water fundraising challenge has raised an incredible £8,000 for The League of Friends.

The Mere Mile, which was sponsored by Shropshire Pools and Spas Ltd, took place on Monday 29th August and saw over 100 swimmers take the plunge and attempt to swim one mile or 2.5 miles in the Mere, Ellesmere.

The hospital Friends and their event partners Swimifinity were pleased to see the event return for the third consecutive year – following on from two hugely successful years which collectively raised just under £30,000.



James Bainbridge of Swimfinity said: "We're really pleased to have been able to help facilitate the event for the third year in a row.

"Congratulations to each and every swimmer who took part so enthusiastically – we're incredibly appreciative of the support the event continues to generate, and the amount raised for charity shows the high regard people have for our wonderful local hospital.

"We're already looking forward to 2023, building on the success of the last three years and continuing to support such a worthy cause."

A number of staff members from the Oswestry based hospital also took part in the event – participants included Mr Ibrahim Roushdi, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon, who took part in the 2.5 mile swim.

Ibrahim said: "There was a great atmosphere on the day, and I thoroughly enjoyed challenging myself to the 2.5 mile swim.

"At RJAH we're incredibly grateful to the League of Friends for holding fundraising events such as the Mere Mile – they raise valuable funds that directly support frontline staff and patients."

A team of volunteers also dedicated their time to help with the running of the event, including members of the Borderlands and Ellesmere Rotary Clubs, safety boat crews, along with kayakers and stand-up paddle boarders who took to the water to ensure the swimmers were kept safe throughout.
