# SUPPORTING RJAH...

### ORTHOPAEDIC INSTITUTE TO CARRY OUT IMPORTANT STUDY THANKS TO THEIR FRIENDS

We are delighted to have provided the Orthopaedic Institute with a significant funding boost which will enable them to carry out an important study.

The funding of £24,000 was officially presented in a ceremonial cheque signing event held at the Oswestry-based hospital at the beginning of August.

Dr Rakieh said: "We are grateful to the Friends for their support – this funding will enable us to accelerate our research efforts, explore new management strategies, and ultimately improve the health and well-being of individuals struggling with osteoporosis and fracture (broken bone), particularly those affected by excessive weight.

"This study will ultimately ensure that patients are receiving the most suitable medication and treatment to help prevent fractures, while alleviating pain and suffering."



# Friends help to upgrade hospital's Occupational Therapy department

We're pleased to have funded equipment for the OT department's workshop and rehabilitation flat.

The workshop is a valuable resource for patients undergoing rehabilitation as an inpatient at RJAH and has a role with outpatient rehabilitation after a life changing injury – it offers a different environment for those interested in developing a skill that can be maintained at home post-discharge.

We have funded an array of tools for use within the workshop, this includes power tools, wood saws, drills kits, claw hammers, vacuum cleaners and a shed for storage.

The rehabilitation flat has recently been refurbished with a new kitchen, bathroom and painting throughout. Additional equipment was required to enable patients to begin using the flat again for overnight stays.

We supported by purchasing a two seater fixed sofa, lift and rise chair, dual care plus profiling bed, memory foam mattress with a zipped waterproof cover and a hoist.



For many patients it is often the first 'home' environment they will experience away from the ward having been in hospital for long periods of time. It enables them to test out care in a safe environment prior to going home, better preparing them for discharge.

Diane Pym, Occupational Therapy Assistant, said: "We are incredibly grateful to the League of Friends for supporting the Occupation Therapy department. Both the flat and workshop play an essential role in a patient's rehabilitation journey – these important upgrades allow us to harness the best possible environment to nurture patients pre-discharge."

Victoria Sugden, Charity Director, said: "We are always pleased to support in ways that have a direct impact on patient care and for patients who have suffered a life changing injury we're delighted to see such a positive impact on their rehabilitation."

### GAMING FUN FOR RJAH'S YOUNG PATIENTS


We have supported the purchase of an Xbox Series S Gaming Cart for Alice Ward in conjunction with Oswestry Borderland Rotary.
