
CRAFTY KNITTERS CREATE CHRISTMAS JOY

WHEELCHAIRS FUNDED TO ENHANCE PATIENT CARE

We are delighted to have funded seven brand-new wheelchairs to benefit RJAH.

These much-needed wheelchairs will enhance the experience and comfort of patients during their stay at hospital, ensuring improved mobility and ease of transport.

Due to increased activity within the hospital, the Portering team, responsible for transporting patients to the services they need, found their existing fleet of wheelchairs struggling to meet the growing demand.

The new wheelchairs were purchased at a total cost of £5,750.





SUPPORTING RJAH...

PREOPERATIVE PATIENTS SUPPORTED BY THEIR FRIENDS

Preoperative patients are being better informed on ways to improve their fitness prior to surgery thanks to support from their Friends.

We have funded the purchase of two SMART TV screens to the value of £2740.

The TV screens deliver videos prepared by the Royal College of Anaesthetists to educate and inform patients on how to improve their fitness prior to surgery.

The addition of these two screens will ensure that patients are better informed and equipped with valuable knowledge on how to prepare for surgery, leading to an improved post-operative experience and smoother recovery.

Glenna Hardy, Nurse Practitioner – Arthroplasty, said: "It is well known that patients who can improve their health and activity levels recover from surgery more quickly, and with fewer complications.

"Thank you to the League of Friends for supporting this initiative and for their continued hard work fundraising to support our patients, relatives and staff at RJAH."

Friends support new wellbeing oasis for ward staff at RJAH

We are delighted to support staff on Powys & Clwyd Ward with enhancements to their outdoor spaces.

We funded essential enhancements to the outdoor area, including the installation of new fence panels, which have transformed the space into a cosy and private wellbeing oasis.

This quiet retreat, situated adjacent to RJAH's Powys and Clwyd wards, provides a much-needed sanctuary for staff to enjoy during their breaks.

Powys is a ward specialising in spinal disorders, while Clwyd focuses on enhanced recovery care.

The newly developed outdoor space was designed with staff wellbeing in mind, offering a tranquil environment where team members can relax, recharge, and momentarily step away from the demands of their busy shifts.

Many ward staff work long 12-hour shifts, and opportunities to leave the ward for a meaningful break are often





limited. The creation of a nearby outdoor retreat has made it easier for staff to take advantage of their breaks, encouraging them to step outside for fresh air and a change of scenery.

Caroline Morris, Ward Manager for Clwyd ward, said: "The wellbeing garden has been a game-changer for our team. Having an outdoor space where we can take a breather during long shifts makes all the difference. It's a place to clear our minds and return to work feeling recharged. Huge thanks to the League of Friends for their kindness and support."

Julia New, Ward Clerk for Powys ward, was able to secure the support of local supermarket Stans who kindly donated plants for their garden. She said: "This new garden area has been such a positive addition for us. We're very thankful to The League of Friends and Stans Superstore for making this possible. The plants have added a beautiful touch that really makes the space feel special."
