


FRIENDS PINK CUPS GO GLOBAL!

We are thrilled to share that the launch of our bright and cheerful pink reusable cups has been met with an overwhelmingly positive response here at RJAH.

Introduced on 2 June, the cups are part of our mission to cut down on single-use takeaway cups in our two hospital coffee shops - the Main Entrance Coffee Shop and the Veterans' Coffee Shop. By making this simple switch, we'll be eliminating 40,000 takeaway cups every year.

Customers now have three eco-friendly options when purchasing takeaway drinks. They can choose to rent a cup by paying a £2 deposit, which is fully refundable when the cup is returned. Alternatively, they can purchase a reusable pink cup for £5 or simply bring their own reusable cup from home - all reusable cups are welcome.

The reaction has been fantastic – the pink cups are flying off the shelves, and we've loved seeing so many patients, staff, volunteers and visitors supporting the campaign. It's such an easy change, but one that's so much better for our planet.



The excitement has also sparked a fun new campaign: #LittlePinkCups. We're encouraging everyone to snap a photo with their pink cup - whether that's at work, at home, on holiday, or even next to a landmark. We've already received brilliant photos from across the UK and overseas, including the Lake District, Zakynthos in Greece, St Aubin in Jersey, and Durban in South Africa!

NEW ULTRASOUND MACHINES BOOST PATIENT CARE

We have funded three brand new ultrasound machines for RJAH, along with a paediatric probe - a total investment of £86,000.

The machines are already in use within the Anaesthetics Department, where demand for ultrasound technology has been growing. Ultrasound plays a vital role in anaesthetic care, allowing clinicians to carry out guided procedures with greater accuracy and safety.

Consultant Anaesthetist Dr James Rudge told us: "These machines are already transforming the way we work increasing capacity and delivering safer care for our patients."

We're proud to provide this vital equipment and delighted to see it already making a real difference across the hospital.

FRIENDS FUND NEW CHECK-IN TERMINALS

We have helped make check-in quicker and easier at RJAH by funding six new digital terminals, worth over £20,000. Patients can now register their arrival in just a few taps, cutting queues and freeing up staff to give extra help where it's needed most. The new kiosks are already improving the flow through clinics and creating a smoother start to appointments. We're proud to support changes that make visits to RJAH more welcoming and stress-free.



Friends support innovative new hip treatment at RJAH



Patients living with a common and often painful hip condition are now benefitting from a new, cutting-edge treatment at RJAH thanks to funding provided by our charity.

Focused shockwave therapy, a non-invasive procedure, has shown outstanding results in patients suffering with Greater Trochanteric Pain Syndrome - also known as hip bursitis.

The treatment was introduced following a major research study led by Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon Mr Robin Banerjee at the Oswestry based hospital.

Conducted over two years and involving more than 100 patients, the study compared standard steroid injections with focused shockwave therapy. Results showed that up to 80% of patients treated with shockwave therapy experienced improvement, compared to just 15% of those who received injections.

The findings were first presented to the British Hip Society and published in 2021. After further evaluation by NHS and NICE, the treatment was recognised as a valid and effective option and with funding from the League of Friends, RJAH has now become the first NHS hospital in the UK to offer it.

Mr Banerjee said: "We were finally given the go-ahead to start treating patients this year – but only after the League of Friends very kindly offered to pay for our new focused shockwave machine. We have treated over 50 patients so far, with more than a hundred still waiting."



We've been busy doing what we do best - supporting the hardworking staff and patients here at RJAH.

While we're well known for funding state-of-the-art equipment and championing innovative projects, we also take pride in meeting smaller, but equally meaningful, needs in the background.

Most recently, we supported the DXA department by funding 16 brand new staff lockers. Following a refurbishment, there was no remaining budget for lockers - so we stepped in. These additions help create a more organised, secure and professional environment for staff to work in every day.

On Sheldon Ward, we were delighted to provide additional furnishings for the Poppy Lounge. This special space has recently had a makeover and is designed to mimic the home environment to support patients with general medicine, dementia, and rehabilitation needs. The result is a comfortable and calming lounge where patients can relax away from the busyness of the ward.

We've also provided Powys Ward with a supply of mini toothpastes for patients. It might seem like a small item, but for someone admitted as an emergency, having access to the basics makes a real difference - helping people feel more comfortable and cared for during their stay.

Earlier in the year, we supported Powys and Clwyd Wards with garden renovations and have continued to assist with further improvements. These outdoor spaces now provide a tranquil haven where staff can take a moment to recharge.

And of course, Flower Friday remains one of our favourite ways to spread joy across the hospital. Thanks to regular donations of beautiful blooms from Marks & Spencer, we deliver bouquets to nominated individuals, teams, or departments. It's a simple but heartfelt way to show appreciation and brighten someone's day.
